(Matthew 1:23-25 The Inclusive Bible).


We light these candles,

Matthew 1:18-25 (The Inclusive Bible)

Joseph, her husband, an upright person unwilling to disgrace her, decided to divorce her quietly. This was Joseph's intention when suddenly the angel of God appeared in a dream and said, "Joseph, heir to the House of David, don't be afraid to wed Mary; it is by the Holy Spirit that she has conceived this child. She is to have a son, and you are to name him Jesus— 'Salvation'— because he will save the people from their sins." All this happened to fulfill what God has said through the prophet:
