We will sing and make melody to God.


We will dare to lift up shouts of joy.

Jesus went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.




# PASTORAL PRAYER AND THE LORD'S PRAYER
