Trust in the One who awakens joy in place of tears.


We will bless our God in all times and places.

* CALL TO CONFESSION

We who are called to be a servant people have often forgotten what it means to sacrifice ourselves for others. Success becomes more attractive than service, and so we focus on getting ahead, which often means leaving behind those who cannot keep up. This is a time to confess selfish motives and hurtful actions. Let us join our voices in the corporate prayer of confession, followed by time for silent personal confession. Thus, we pray together:

THE READINGS

Epistle

Hebrews 7:23-28 (Inclusive Bible)

There's another difference: there were so many priests in the old Covenant because death prevented them from continuing their work. But Christ lives on forever, and Christ's work as priest doesn't pass on to someone else. And so Christ is able, now and always, to save those who come to God through Christ, because Christ lives forever to plead to God for them.

God ordained that we should have such a high priest—one who is holy, who has no fault or sin, who has been set apart from sinners, and raised above the

heavens. Jesus is not like other high priests and doesn't need to offer sacrifices every day, first for personal sins and then for the sins of the people.

Christ's self-sacrifice was offered once and for all. For the Law appoints as high priests people who are weak; but God's sworn promise, which came later than the Law, appoints the Only Begotten, who has been made perfect forever.

The Holy Spirit has a word for each of us today.

With God's help we are listening.

They came to Jericho. As Jesus was leaving Jericho with the disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus ben-Timaeus, was sitting by the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and to say, "Heir of David, Jesus, have pity on me!" Many people scolded him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the louder, "Heir of David, have pity on me!" Jesus stopped and said, "Call him here." So they called the blind man. "Don't be afraid," they said. "Get up, Jesus is calling you." So throwing off his cloak, Bartimaeus jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus said, "What do you want me to do for you?" "Rabbuni," the blind man said, "I want to see." Jesus replied, "Go; your faith has saved you." And immediately Bartimaeus received the gift of sight and began to follow Jesus along the road.

The visible church has the privilege Larger Catechism of being under God's special care and government; of being protected and preserved in all ages, notwithstanding the opposition of all enemies; and of enjoying the communion of saints, the ordinary means of salvation, and offers of grace by Christ, to all members of it, in the ministry of the gospel, testifying that whosoever believes in him shall be saved, and excluding none that will come unto him. The church's commission, Theological Declaration of Barmen upon which its freedom is founded, consists in delivering the message of the free grace of God to all people in Christ's stead, and therefore in the ministry

of his own Word and work

through sermon and Sacrament.

The church confesses its faith when it bears a present witness to God's grace in Jesus Christ. The life, death, resurrection, and promised coming of Jesus Christ has set the pattern for the church's mission. The church follows this pattern in the form of its life and in the method of its action. So to live and serve is to confess Christ as Lord.
