"The days are surely coming, says Үнwн, when I will bestow on Israel and Judah all the blessings I promised them." (Jeremiah 33:14).


Beloved, the days are surely coming when the yearning of the land; the longing of the sun, moon, and stars;



with prophets, apostles, and martyrs,


and with all the faithful of every time and place


LAND OF REST

PRAYER FOR THE HOLY SPIRIT


