Yet you welcome us, not as strangers but as heralds of your reign.


We want to worship you and to represent you well.

THE READINGS

Epistle

James 2: 1-17 (First Nations Version)

My sacred family members, as you trust in our bright and shining Honored Chief, Creator Sets Free (Jesus) the Chosen One, do not treat one person better than another. Let us say someone comes into your sacred gathering wearing fine clothes and costly jewelry, and some poor person comes in dressed in rags. Then you give more honor to the one wearing the fine clothes, saying, "Come, sit here in this honored place," but you say to the one dressed in rags, "Go, stand over there," or, "Sit here on the floor where people lay their feet." If you treat people in this way, have you not decided that some among you are better than others and acted like crooked council members with bad hearts? Hear me, my much loved sacred family members! Did not the Great Spirit choose the ones the world looks down on as poor to be rich in trusting and sharers together in the good road that Creator has promised to those who love him? Why would you show no respect for the poor. Is it not the rich who drag you down and bring you before their own corrupt councils? Are they not the ones who speak evil against the Honorable Name spoken over you?

If you "love your fellow human beings in the same way you love yourselves," as it says in the Sacred Teachings, you are doing well, for you are walking in the true meaning and purpose of the law of our Honored Chief. But if you treat one person better than another, you are walking in broken ways and guilty of not following our Sacred Teachings. For whoever does everything our tribal law requires yet fails in one thing is guilty of breaking all of it. The one who told us to be faithful in marriage also told us not to take the life of another. If you are faithful in marriage but take away the life of another, you have become one who fails to keep the law. In all that you say and do, remember that it is the Chosen One's law of freedom that Creator will use to decide for or against you. When the Great Spirit decides, no mercy will be shown to those who have not shown mercy. On the other hand, the ones who have shown mercy will have mercy shown them. So then, Mercy wins the victory over judgment.

What good is it, my sacred family members, if a man says, "I have faith," but has no deeds to show for it? Can that kind of "faith" set him free and make him whole? If a family member or any human being has no clothes to wear or no food to eat, and you say, "Go in peace; stay warm and eat well," but fail to give what is needed, what good have you done? In the same way, without deeds, faith by itself is dead.

The Holy Spirit has a word for each of us today. With God's help we are listening.

Gospel

Mark 7:24-37 (First Nations Version)

From there, Creator Sets Free (Jesus) journeyed into the territory of Rock Land (Tyre) and Hunting Grounds (Sidon). He wanted to keep away from the crowds, so he found a house to stay out of sight but was unable to stay hidden. A woman came to him who had a daughter with an unclean spirit in her. As soon as she heard about Creator Sets Free (Jesus), she came and humbled herself before him. She was an Outsider from the territory along the coastline of the Great Middle Sea (Mediterranean). She begged Creator Sets Free (Jesus) to force the evil spirit out of her daughter. "The children must be fed first," he said "It is not right to take the children's portion and throw it to the dogs." "But Wisdom Keeper," she answered back, "even the dogs under the table can eat the children's crumbs." "Because your words are well chosen," he replied, "you may return home. You will find that the evil spirit has left your daughter." The woman went home and found her daughter resting on her sleeping mat—the evil spirit had left her.

From the Territory of Rock Land (Tyre) Creator Sets Free (Jesus) went through Hunting Grounds (Sidon) to the Lake of Circle of Nations (Sea of Galilee) in the territory of the Ten Villages (Decapolis). The people who lived there brought a man who could not hear of speak right. They begged Creator Sets Free (Jesus) to lay his hands on him. So he took the man away from the crowd. When he was alone with him, he put his fingers into the man's ears, and then spit and touched the man's tongue. He then looked up into the spirit-world above, let out a deep breath, and said, "Ephphatha!" which means, "Be opened." Right then the man's ears were opened, and his tongue was released. He could now hear and speak clearly! Creator Sets Free (Jesus) then instructed the people to tell no one. But the more he told them not to, the more they told the story to others. The people were amazed beyond belief and full of wonder. "He does all things well!" they told everyone. "He even heals the ones who cannot hear or speak!"
