* INVOCATION PRAYER


Let us pray together:

Hebrew Scripture Jeremiah 17:5-10 (Inclusive Bible)

YHWH says:

Cursed are those who trust in human ways,

It stands in stony wastes in the desert,

You who are hungry now are blessed,

for you'll be filled.

You who weep now are blessed,

for you'll laugh.

You are blessed when people hate you, when they scorn and insult you and spurn your name as evil because of the Chosen One. On the day they do so, rejoice and be glad: your reward will be great in heaven, for their ancestors treated the prophets the same way.

But woe to you rich,

for you are now receiving your comfort in full.

Woe to you who are full,

for you'll go hungry.

Woe to you who laugh now,

for you'll weep in your grief.


Woe to you when all speak well of you, for their ancestors treated the false prophets in the same way."


