THE READINGS

Epistle

Galatians 6:1-16 (Inclusive Bible)

Sisters and brothers, if one of you is caught in any sin, the more spiritual among you should correct the offender in a spirit of gentleness—remembering that you may be tempted yourselves. Bear one another's burdens, and thus fulfill the law of Christ. But if you think you are important when you are not, you are deceiving yourselves. Examine your own work, each of you. If you find something to boast about, at least it's something of your own and not just empty comparison with your neighbor. Carry your own load!

Those under instruction in the word should always contribute to the support of the instructor. Don't be deceived—God cannot be cheated: where you sow, there you will reap. If you sow in the field of self-indulgence, you will reap corruption. If you sow in the field of the Spirit, you will reap the harvest of eternal life. Never grow tired of doing good. We will reap a harvest at the proper time—if you don't grow weary. So, while we still have time, do good to all and especially to those of the household of faith.

Look how big these letters are when I write in my own hand! Those who are pressuring the men among you to be circumcised are only trying to win favor with others, so they won't be persecuted for the cross of Christ. They themselves are circumcised but don't even keep the Law. They want you to accept circumcision just so they can boast about it. May I never boast of anything but the cross of our Savior Jesus Christ! Through it the world has been crucified to me and I to the world. It means nothing whether one bothers with the externals of religion or not. All that matters is that one is created anew. Peace and mercy on all who follow this rule of life and on the Israel of God.

The Holy Spirit has a word for each of us today.

With God's help we are listening.

After this, Jesus appointed seventy-two others, and sent them on ahead in pairs to every town and place where he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is rich, but the workers are few; therefore, ask the overseer to send out workers to the harvest. Be on your way; and remember: I am sending you as lambs in the midst of wolves. Don't carry a walking stick or a knapsack; wear no sandals and greet no one along the way. And whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be upon this house!' If the people live peaceably there, your peace will rest on them; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in that house, eating and drinking what they give you, for the laborer is worth a wage. Don't keep moving house to house. And whatever city you enter, after they welcome you, eat what they set before you and heal those who are sick in that town. Say to them, 'The reign of God has drawn near to you.' If the people of any town you enter don't welcome you, go into the streets and say, 'We shake the dust of this town from our feet as a testimony against you. But know that the reign of God has drawn near.'

Anyone who listens to you, listens to me. Anyone who rejects you, rejects me; and those who reject me rejects the One who sent me."

The seventy-two disciples returned with joy, saying, "Rabbi, even the demons obey us in your name!" Jesus replied, "I watched Satan fall from the sky like lightning. Look, I've given you the power to tread on snakes and scorpions—even the forces of the enemy—and nothing will ever injure you.

Nevertheless, don't rejoice in the fact that the spirits obey you so much as your names are inscribed in heaven."
