THE READINGS

Tanach

Jeremiah 18:1-11 (Inclusive Bible)

This word came to Jeremiah from YHWH: "Get up and make your way down to the potter's house. I will give you my message there."

So I went down to the potter's house, and there the potter was working at the wheel. Whenever the object of clay that the potter was making turned out badly, the potter tried again, making of the clay another object, of whatever sort the potter pleased.

Then the word of YHWH came to me: "House of Israel, can I not do to you what this potter does?—it is YHWH who speaks. Indeed, like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand, house of Israel. At any moment I may announce that a nation or a dominion is to be uprooted, pulled down or destroyed. But if the nation I threatened abandons its depraved ways, I will change my mind and not inflict on it the disaster I planned. At another moment I may announce that I will build up a nation or establish one. But if it does something displeasing to me, refusing to listen to my voice, then I will reconsider the good I had intended to do for it.

Now, therefore, say to the people of Judah and the inhabitants of Jerusalem: 'Thus says YHWH: Beware! I am preparing a disaster for you and devising a plan against you. Turn from your evil life, each one of you, give up your evil ways, amend your conduct.'"

The Holy Spirit has a word for each of us today.

With God's help we are listening.

Large crowds followed Jesus. He turned to them and said, "If any of you come to me without turning your back on your mother and your father, your loved ones, your sisters and brothers, indeed your very self, you can't be my follower. Anyone who doesn't take up their cross and follow me can't be my disciple.

If one of you were going to build a tower, wouldn't you first sit down and calculate the outlay to see if you have enough money to complete the project? You'd do that for fear of laying the foundation and then not being able to complete the work—because anyone who saw it would jeer at you and say, 'You started a building and couldn't finish it.'

Or if the leaders of one country were going to declare war on another country, wouldn't they first sit down and consider whether, with an army of ten thousand, they could win against an enemy coming against them with twenty thousand? If they couldn't, they'd send a delegation while the enemy is still at a distance, asking for terms of peace.

So count the cost. You can't be my disciple if you don't say goodbye to all of your possessions.






This text affirms that Christian unity is not achievement but gift, one renewed each time we gather for the Lord's Supper. Each of us enters as an "I" and leaves as part of "we." The unadorned language of this text is well matched to the simple shape note tune that sets it here.

* INVITATION TO THE MEAL

Let us entrust our futures, even to the end of our days, to the One who is most able to guide us through them, toward a rich inheritance of joy and fullness.

Christ has called us in faith to receive the gift of life.

But it comes at a cost – a cost we may not have counted.

Yet in his own life, Christ did weigh the cost of life for us, and counted it worthy of his own life.

Our inheritance comes as a gift from God alone. Our future is secure in God's hands.

Let us now weigh the value of this free gift, and rejoice in this inheritance as we remember that night on which our Lord was betrayed.

Great is the mystery of faith.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.
